

Spanish Rule (1282 – 1530)

- 1283 – 1412 Aragonese rule.
- 1412 – 1530 Aragonese and Castilian rule.
- 1350 – 1357 First incorporation into Royal Domain (of Aragon).
- 1350 Establishment of Maltese Nobility.
- 1370 Malta falls under the jurisdiction of Aragon. The islands have limited local self-government through the institution of the "Università" but were often made a fiefdom of various governors.
- 1393 – 1397 Time of the Tyrants – Malta given to feudal lords.
- 1397 – 1420 Second incorporation into Royal Domain.
- 15th century Emergence of a Università, or local governing body, under Aragonese tutelage.
- 1420 Feudal possession of Don Antonio Cardona.
- 1425 Revolt against Don Consalvo de Monroy.
- 1428 – 1530 Last incorporation into Royal Domain.
- 1428 The Università redeems the islands in perpetuity from fiefdom.
- 1429 Tunisian Saracens fail to capture of islands.
Malta is sacked by corsairs from the Barbary coast.
Malta sacked by Muslims.
- 1436 The ten principal settlements on Malta are raised to Parish status like Mdina and Birgu.
